Course	Description	Sessions
Intermediate Biblical Studies (BIB200)	Students explore the Old and New Testament Scriptures in the context of different interpretations that different schools of thought have produced. The aim of this module is to provide understanding that different interpretations are made of Scriptures coming out of the missional contexts of different church traditions. They reflect on their own church tradition compared to others.	24 one hour sessions over 12 weeks
Intermediate Missional Theology (TH200)	This module covers missional church theology. It enables students to understand how their churches beliefs and practices inform their approaches to engaging with their local communities to share the gospel. It also focuses on the Holy Spirit and the way that different Christian traditions understand the work of the Holy Spirit in helping them to engage in God's mission.	24 one hour sessions over 12 weeks
Missional Research Methods applied to church planting approaches (MS200)	This module enables students to engage with ethnographic research methods which practically help them to understand the non-Christian communities they want to plant their churches among. It also considers different effective approaches to church planting which students may wish to explore further.	24 one hour sessions over 12 weeks
Intermediate Missional Ministry (MMIN200)	This module enables students to understand how missional team ministry works from a number of different perspectives in the context of general ministry in the church. It also enables them to understand and develop effective narrative based preaching and communication approaches.	24 one hour sessions over 2 x 2 day residential intensives*
Intermediate Missional Youth Ministry (YTH200)	This module enables students to understand how missional team ministry works from a number of different perspectives in the context of youth ministry. It also enables them to understand and produce effective narrative based preaching and communication approaches.	24 one hour sessions over 2 x 2 day residential intensives*



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<p>Missional Media (MM200)</p>	<p>Students are enabled to understand the key theories of missional media in the contexts of audio-visual media, web-based, television, radio and social media.</p>	<p>24 one hour sessions over 2 x 2 day residential intensives*</p>
<p>Reverse Mission (RM200)</p>	<p>Students are enabled to understand the critical themes of missional groups taking the gospel to another cultural group other than their own. The concept of reverse mission is that during the 19th and early 20th centuries western Christians took the gospel to non-Christian nations outside the west. Now the tables have turned and these nations are bringing the gospel back to westerners. The key question is, how can we equip reverse missionaries to engage in cross-cultural missional practice so they can effectively bring the gospel back to the west.</p>	<p>24 one hour sessions over 2 x 2 day residential intensives*</p>
<p>Pastoral Counselling (PC200)</p>	<p>Students are enabled to have understanding of some theories about pastoral counselling, as well as learning some of the key skills that professional counsellors use to counsel clients. It does not make a student a qualified counsellor, but it does provide a student with useful knowledge and skills to offer basic help to people they offer pastoral support to.</p>	<p>24 one hour sessions over 2 x 2 day residential intensives*</p>
<p>Theology of Worship (WT200)</p>	<p>This module enables students to explore cutting edge theories about Christian worship that directly, and practically, apply to effective worship ministries in the Christian community.</p>	<p>24 one hour sessions over 2 x 2 day residential intensives*</p>
